CS: Your color palettes in some of your New York projects borrow from nature, with neutrals dominating for a serene effect. Do you use these calmer colors to help balance the hectic lives/ feel of the city and your clients' lives? What about these colors most appeals to you?

PP: Yes, absolutely. Your home should be your haven. Regardless of your aesthetic, you should walk in the door and feel an instant sense of calm - even if the world around you is chaotic (as it usually is in NYC!). Neutral colors and organic, natural accents immediately ground a space in a kind of serenity. I also love the idea of starting with a neutral palette and then letting the accessories be the statement pieces.

CS: How do you balance more traditional and modern elements in your designs?

PP: I think it's so important to mix modern and traditional elements to create original spaces. I never want my designs to look like a showroom. I want them to look and feel like homes, and in a home there are different personalities and moods and these should be reflected in the design.

Adding a vintage piece or a modern take on a traditional item (such as a washed-out antique rug) is what makes a space interesting. It's crucial to get the balance right though. Too many or too few of these kinds of accents can totally throw off the harmony. I have a few go-to sources for fabulous accents. Online, you can often find great pieces at a great price at One Kings Lane. In New York, I visit Abhaya, Andrianna Shamaris, and Ochre when I'm on the hunt for really special pieces.



CS: What's been a memorable challenge you've had to face on a design project?

PP: I had a client this year who was moving to a larger space but wanted to keep much of his existing furniture. It was very difficult to create a fresh aesthetic while incorporating so many pieces from his past. To overcome this, we used color theory to develop a palette that worked for both the existing pieces and the new additions. We played with proportion so that the eye was drawn to the new pieces first. And we invested in eye-catching window treatments and wall coverings to transform the space.



CS: Is there any designer advice you could offer CasaSugar's home decor enthusiasts?



CS How does your background in style and beauty influence your interior design process?

PP: It plays a huge role, actually. Interior design is, in essence, an extension of personal style. Just as people use fashion and beauty to convey a certain style and feel a certain way, interior design can communicate an attitude, a feeling. Many of the concepts used to create interesting fashion/beauty design overlap in interiors - color, texture, proportion, and pattern, just to name a few. And many of the strategies are similar as well; for example, mixing high- and low-end pieces, adding a pop of color to an otherwise neutral palette, and including one crazy, eclectic piece in an understated landscape.

It was a very seamless transition to go from fashion and beauty to interior design - you just have a larger canvas to work with!
